Atlanta, GA: Christmas is a joyous occasion all around the world. Palmer Paramadhas, Pastor of Atlanta Tamil Church. With the culmination of the Word of God, the service concluded with greetings and reports from the church Elders. The annual church photograph was taken and traditional festive lunch – biryani was served. The air was cold but the hearts were warm and aglow and true to the words in the children's Christmas carol, "Christmas time comes once a year; it's here and then it's gone...but if you have Christ in your heart...then Christmas will live on..."

A week later, church members and guests from nearby states gathered together for a watch night service to usher in the New Year, 2016 in the presence of God. The church choir led the congregation with a series of praise and worship songs, that set a deep sense of gratitude for the goodness and mercy of God in 2015 and an expectation of greater things to happen in the New Year 2016. The church had a special testimony from Evangeline Justifus and Justifus Asir on how God carried them through their battle with cancer as a family and brought them out stronger than before on the other side. In the New Year Rev. Palmer revealed the promise of 2016 to the church and expounded on it. " ...
